


Starting a Company -Ask Yourself...

can you deal with *all* the elements of entrepreneurship, or are you expecting just the fun stuff?

According to the SBA: roughly 50-90% of small businesses fail within the first five years.





Business Idea Validation

Ask Yourself: Is there a genuine market for your idea?

- What problem are you solving? (value proposition)
- Who are you solving this for? (target audience)
- Why you and not the competition? (differentiation)





Business Idea Validation Four Phases -checklist:

- Documenting key assumptions
- ► Talking to potential customers
- Updating your assumptions
- Estimating funding needs

- ► Elevator pitch =verbal, concise is key
- Describe Benefits not features
- Who is your target audience(s) and how many are there = sales volume where are they?
- Differentiation: Why you and not competitor?

Business Planning


- Business Plans are always wrong...
 But Vital
 - 1. We're human
 - 2. Predicting the future, we'll often guess wrong
 - 3. Helps track/validates assumptions (hypotheses)
 - 4. Ties unexpected to results in context of goals
 - 5. Provides Strategy accountability
 - 6. Focus on approach, not document format
 The traditional Business Plan only "required" by Financing

Elements of 'traditional' Business Plan

- 1. Executive Summary (1-2 pages write last?)
- 2. Problem & Solution (real problem, willing to pay to solve)
- 3. Target Market & Competition
- 4. Marketing & Sales Plan (position, pricing, promotion)
- 5. Operations/Implementation Plan (how/when deliver)
- 6. Milestones & Metrics
- 7. Assumptions & Risks
- 8. Team & Company Overview
- 9. Financial Projections
 - Profit/Loss (based on sales forecast)
 - CashFlow
 - Balance Sheet
 - Spending plan/details for the cash ASK





Business Planning Sources of Financing

- 1. **Self-Funding** (reserves of at least 6 months, 12-18 months better)
- 2. Lender (banks, credit unions, CDFIs, Government)
 - ► 5 C's of CREDIT -evaluation framework
- 3. **Investor** (Friends & Family / Angel, Venture Capitalists, Shareholders)
- 4. CrowdFunding (GoFund.me, kickstarter.com, indiegogo.com)
- 5. **Grants** (tough for 'For-profits')






- 1. Character

- 2. Federal (IRS) business tax ID number
 - -also called your Employer Identification Number (EIN)
 - ▶ online https://sa.www4.irs.gov/modiein/individual/index.jsp or call toll-free at (800) 829-1040
- 3. Register chosen Entity to do business in Hawaii
 - ► General Excise Tax Application, form BB-1 w/DOTAX
- 4. Obtain any federal, state or county licenses or permits depending on industry/activity
 - For Hawaii, Check DCCA's Professions & Vocations Licensing Div cca.hawaii.gov/pvl.





Forms of Business Organization - Hawaii

HAVVAIG S D D C S S D E S S D E V E L O P M E N T C E N T E R

Defined by Hawaii State Law:

- ► Hawaii Revised Statutes (HRS)
- Includes for-profit corporations created under HRS Chapter 414, non-profit corporations created under HRS Chapter 414D, and professional corporations created under HRS Chapter 415A.

Determines:

- Amount of internal administration required
- ► Tax licenses and Taxes to pay (which tax returns to file)
- How Liabilities are handled and who owns the organization's assets



Forms of Organization (Register w/ DCCA)

- Sole Proprietorship -(tradename -dba)
 - ▶ No liability nor tax distinction between the owner and the business
 - Personal risk but simple administrative set-up and low cost
 - ▶ If business name desired, need: form T-1 for tradename registration
- Partnerships -General, Limited Liability
 - ▶ No legal distinction between the owner(s) and the business
 - ▶ Registration Statement, form GP-1
 - Statement of Qualification, form LLP-1

Limited Liability Company (LLC)

- Business legally (liability) separate from owner(s) But pass-thru tax entity
- ► Simple registration and administration; distribute profits as see fit
- Articles of Organization, form LLC-1
- Corporation "S" or "C" or "B"
 - Business legally (liability) separate from owner(s) w/ possible tax savings
 - Extra Admin requires scheduled meetings, minutes, by-laws, stock maintenance
 - ► Articles of Incorporation, form DC-1
 - ▶ Non-Profit Articles of Incorporation, form DNP-1



Federal (IRS) Employer ID Number (EIN)

(aka Federal Tax ID Number)



- EIN identifies your business to IRS and is used to file federal tax returns. Needed if:
 - ▶ Have Employees
 - Corporation, S-Corp, Partnership -or-(LLC filing partnership or corporate income tax return)
 - A single-member LLC that is a disregarded entity that does not have employees and does not have a federal excise tax liability does not need an EIN

Hawaii Tax ID

General Excise Tax (GET) License + Employers Witholding TaxID



- Form BB-1, Hawaii Basic Business Application
 - ► Applicant & TaxID is the Entity
 - one-time \$20 registration fee
 (additional fees and licenses available: transient accommodations, cigarette and tobacco, liquor)
 - online DOTAX (2-4 days)

 - online HBE.ehawaii.gov (3-5 days)

Taxes

- HAVVA BDC SMALL BUSINESS DEVELOPMENT CENTER
- ► General Excise Tax (GET) State Tax (and Use Tax)
 - Transient Accommodations
 - ► Rental Motor Vehicle, Tour Vehicle, and Car-Sharing Surcharge Tax
- ► Income Tax -State
- ► Income Tax -Federal
- **Self-Employment** (Self Social Security/Medicare)
- Employers Tax Responsibilities (Payroll Taxes -Federal & State, withholding responsibilities, quarterly submissions)
 - Unemployment Insurance
 - Workers Compensation Insurance
 - Workers Disability Insurance



Taxes - Hawaii General Excise Tax

- privilege tax imposed on business activity
- imposed on gross revenue of business including costs passed on to customer
- paid monthly, quarterly, or semi + annual
- ► Rates:
 - 0.5% on wholesaling activities
 - 4.0% on retail activities
 - + county surcharges (rail-Oahu, Big Isle)

Taxes - Hawaii General Excise Tax

► Rates: state= 4.0% on retail activities

+ county surcharges

+ pass on percentage

County	Rate	PassOn	Effective Date
City & County of Honolulu	4% +0.50% =	4.7120%	Jan 1, 2007 to Dec 31, 2030
County of Kauai	4% +0.50% =	4.7120%	Jan 1, 2019 to Dec 31, 2030
County of Hawaii	4% +0.50% =	4.7120%	Jan 1, 2020 to Dec 31, 2030
County of Maui	4% +0.00% =	4.1666%	No county surcharge

Taxes -Self Employment

Social Security (paying it forward) Employer matches Employee

- - 6.2% of earnings paid by Employer
 - 6.2% of earnings withheld from Employee

--VS--

Self-Employed pays: 12.4% of earnings

Medicare (paying it forward)

- ► Employer matches Employee
 - 1.45% of earnings paid by Employer
 - 1.45% of earnings withheld from Employee

--VS--

Self-Employed pays: 2.9% of earnings



Total - Self-Employed Tax pays:

15.3% of earnings



Taxes (very rough planning percentage)



- ► General Excise Tax (GET) State
 - ► 4% Gross Revenue (sales)
- ► Income Tax -State & Federal
 - State: 2%-11% based on bracket of Net Earnings+Tips
 - Federal: 10%-40% based on bracket of Net Earnings+Tips
- ► Social Security / Self Employment -Federal
 - ► 15.3% <u>Net</u> Earnings+Tips
